Do you know what you have agreed to? Learn the fundamentals of contract law and its impact on pharmacy practice. Emphasis is given to: sources of contract law, elements of an enforceable contract, contract interpretation, revocation, and breach. Current contract issues such as PBMs and access to drugs and raw materials during shortages are discussed. Participants engage in evaluating contract language and deciding what contract language they would prefer to sign.
